East Area Rapist Returns To District, Assaults Teen-Aged Girl In Duplex

Sacramento sheriff's investigators say the east area rapist struck Saturday for the first time in this area in four months when he assaulted a 17-year-old girl visiting her boyfriend in his duplex home east of the city limits in the College Greens-Rosemont area.

The attack brought to 22 the number of assaults attributed to the elusive rapist in 19 months. The latest attack occurred 25 days after the same man is believed to have raped a 28-year-old woman in Stockton.

Law enforcement officials here believed the rapist had been driven from Sacramento by civilian vigilante patrols and widespread publicity that caused a run on local gun stores and home security devices. The assailant entered the duplex in the area of La Riviera and Tuolumne Drives at about 1:30 Saturday morning through either an open sliding glass door or window, according to sheriff's spokesman Bill Miller.

Wounded SF Police Officer Decoy Dies Despite Surgery

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — Police-man Douglas Gibbs, 27, shot in the heart in a Tenderloin decoy operation, died Saturday at San Francisco General Hospital.

lookout while a plainclothes officer, feigning he was injured, was approached by a man. The man lifted the officer's wallet and started running.

He was carrying a flashlight and a handgun and was wearing what appeared to be a stocking mask. He forced the victim into the living room after he tied up the boyfriend with whom she was visiting. The rapist left after about an hour.

Gibbs, a father of three small children and five-year veteran on the force, had been in a coma since he was wounded Monday while trying to take a suspect into custody.

Gibbs stopped the suspect. While he was searching him, the suspect's associate approached him and shot him in the chest with a .38-caliber pistol.

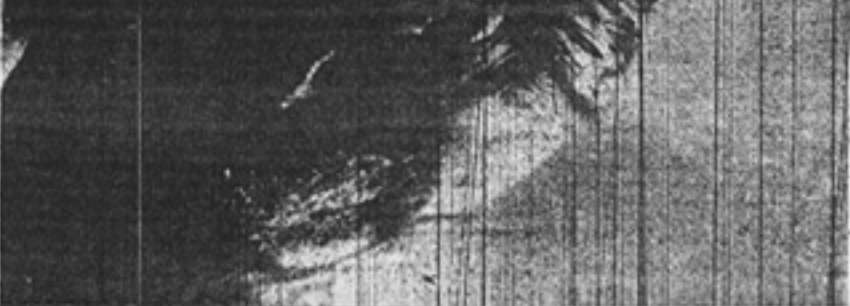
Asked if deputies were certain that the man was the same man and not a "copy cat," Miller said, "We're certain enough to list it as an east area rapist case."

His heart stopped during emergency surgery immediately after the shooting, and doctors said he had suffered irreversible brain damage. Police said Gibbs was serving as a

The assailant was captured by the plainclothes officer. His associate was picked up later. The one who shot Gibbs was identified as Ramon Salcido, 33, an ex-convict with a long criminal record.

Miller said the number of attacks attributed to the east area rapist has been revised downward because two assaults which occurred in October

Miller said there weren't enough facts to be sure the attacks were by the same man.

The spokesman noted that Saturday's attack was not the first time the rapist has struck in a multi-unit building. He also confirmed that on at least two other occasions . . . the first and second attacks . . . the victim was spending the night at a place where she normally would not be.

Miller said that the rapist in the latest case took something from the duplex after his attack, but refused to identify the item.

Widow Dozes During Oswald 'Trial' Movie

CHANDLER, Tex. (AP) — ABC-TV's movie "The Trial of Lee Harvey Oswald" is "pretty true," Oswald's widow says — but its truthfulness didn't keep her from falling asleep while watching it.

In an interview with the Dallas Times Herald, Marina Oswald Porter said she dozed during the first segment aired Friday night. The concluding two-hour segment will be shown Sunday night.

She is the widow of the man identified by the Warren Commission as the person who acted alone in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy at Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963.

Mrs. Porter, who has said she believed her husband was guilty, said "I thought it was pretty true.

per cent in the first three years of this administration. With inflation it isn't necessary to raise the rates when you have a progressive income tax that sees people paying higher surtax rates because of cost-of-living pay raises. And, of course, the property tax increase reflected inflationary increases in assessed valuations.

"When they proposed property tax relief it was only a thinly-disguised form of income redistribution."

Reagan said he had "tried to lean over backwards to avoid criticizing the current administration.

"But none of us — none of us — can tolerate men and women in places of appointed responsibility trying to destroy the economic hopes and dreams of this great state."

In attacking the Carter administration, Reagan charged the President with breaking promises and with "misjudgments, mistatements and mismanagement."

He accused Carter of going back on campaign promises made in Oklahoma and Texas to seek deregulation of new natural gas supplies and of supporting spending programs which would make balancing the budget impossible.

The former governor was restrained in his criticism of the Panama Canal treaty during his speech, saying little more than that the U.S. Senate should reject it and propose "constructive alternatives."

There was little need, however, for Reagan to have made an issue of the treaty before the convention. Virtually all opinions being expressed publicly here were in opposition to the treaty.

Former President Gerald Ford, whose Republican administration helped to draft the document, supported it during a Friday press conference but ignored the issue while speaking to the convention later that evening.

U.S. Sen. S.I. Hayakawa told reporters here Saturday afternoon that he hasn't made up his mind finally on the issue but right now is leaning "60-40" in favor of the treaty.
