Attorney Randolph Cooke, who filed  
the suit, said he would be meeting  
with representatives of the county  
Welfare Department and the United  
Public Assistance Workers Union to  
see if a solution can be worked out.

The suit, filed last Friday, said that  
Welfare Department Director Wil-  
liam Redmond announced May 31 that  
half of his staff, or 1,307 persons,  
would be laid off on the basis of senior-  
ity if Proposition 13 passed.

Such a move would effectively nullify  
the results of the department's  
minority hiring programs over the  
past six years, the suit contends,  
which have increased the percentage  
of minorities from 10 to 25 percent.

The proposition is unconstitutional,  
the plaintiffs said, because it deprives  
them of their right to full employ-  
ment, due process and equal protec-  
tion under the law.

**Rapist Credited  
With 2 Attacks**

After further investigation, two  
rapes committed in Davis this month  
will officially be attributed to the East  
Area rapist, the Sacramento County  
Sheriff's Department said Monday.

The rapist reportedly assaulted a  
32-year-old Davis housewife Saturday  
morning and a 21-year-old University  
of California, Davis student on June 7.

Sheriff's spokesman Bill Miller said  
the two Davis attacks brings to 37 the  
number of attacks attributed to the  
rapist. The assailant has been operat-  
ing in the Sacramento area since late  
1975.
